RESPECT- Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day gives us a chance to honour armed forces members who have died in the line of duty. Remembrance Day is observed on 11th of November to recall the end of First World War hostilities. Hostilities formally ended "at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month" of 1918.

As part of the Jewellery Quarter Academy tradition, our CCF students went to Warstone Lane to lead the community events. Students recited poems, read the names of the fallen and explored the "Shared Remembrance" poppy tapestry.









RESPECT- International Day of Persons with Disabilities

Saturday 3rd December was International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD). International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) is a UN day that is celebrated every year on 3 December.

The day is about promoting the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities at every level of society and development, and to raise awareness of the situation of persons with disabilities in all aspects of political, social, economic, and cultural life. WHO joins the UN in observing this day each year, reinforcing the importance of securing the rights of people with disabilities, so they can participate fully, equally and effectively in society with others, and face no barriers in all aspects of their lives.

Students had the opportunity to learn about the history of IDPD and to demonstrate respect and empathy for people with disabilities around the world.

RESPECT- White Ribbon Day

The **White Ribbon Campaign** (**WRC**) is a global movement of men and boys working to end male violence against women and girls. It was formed by a group of pro-feminist men in Toronto, Ontario, in November 1991 as a response to the École Polytechnique massacre of female students by Marc Lépine in 1989.

The campaign was intended to raise awareness about the prevalence of male violence against women, with the ribbon symbolizing "the idea of men giving up their arms". Active in over 60 countries, the movement seeks to promote healthy relationships, gender equity, and a compassionate vision of masculinity. In the UK, White Ribbon Day is observed on the 25th of November.

Mr Condley, Head of Year 9, delivered an assembly to all year groups to show the importance of White Ribbon Day and how we can as a society to end violence against women and girls.





RESPECT- Anti-Bullying events

Anti-Bullying Week is an annual UK event held in the third week in November which aims to raise awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. Anti-Bullying Week is organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA) in England, which is made up of about 140 member organizations.

Jewellery Quarter Academy takes all different types of bullying very seriously. We promote our SHARP system, which allows young people to report any incidents including bullying anonymously and without fear.

We also promoted anti-bullying week with an assembly for all our year groups. This was conducted by Miss Cutler......

Odd Socks Day is a national event all about celebrating what makes someone unique. It's organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance which is a group of organisations, charities and individuals who work together to try and stop bullying. Many of our staff and students wore odd socks in promoting anti-bullying week.


EXCELLENCE-The JQA Way

What amazing work the have created!!!!














EXCELLENCE AT JQA-Student Parliament
