I am pleased to report the behaviour data for this week. There are 304 students that have received no negative behaviour points this week, and 474 students who have received positive behaviour points. The year group with the most positive behaviour points this week, are year 10. Well done year 10! Please discuss this continued positive behaviour at Jewellery Quarter Academy with your children. "This week selected pupils took part in a Hamilton Workshop courtesy of our connection with Birmingham Hippodrome Education Network. This workshop explored musical theatre and gave our pupils some fantastic insights into the industry as well as ignite some ideas for their Hamilton Project which pupils will perform in July! Pupils loved every second of this workshop and were able to link it to what they are learning in the Drama curriculum too"

Assemblies this week have focused on Child Safety. All year groups have been given information on how to minimise the risk of accidents in the home and travelling to and from school. We have launched a form time competition this week based on advice on how pupils on how we they help keep safe. We are excited to see all the poster entries with all the key points and ideas from all year groups - entries are due in this Friday 7th June.

As part of the Personal Development this week, the students will be looking at the theme "Living in the wider world," in which each year group will be financial decisions (Year 7), digital literacy (Year 8), employability skills (Year 9) and work experience (Year 10). Throughout our respect sessions every Friday, students will be looking at how to be respectful within school and the community. It is particularly important for our students to make sure that they conduct themselves appropriately around the area. Year 10 students will be having 1-2-1 interviews with Connexions, an external company who work with young people and looking at post-16 provision, starting on Friday 7th of June. This will help the students to think about of what they want to do when they leave Jewellery Quarter Academy next summer.

Students enjoyed being back on the track at Alexader Stadium today as part of our ongoing partnership with Birchfield Harriers. This half term in Key Stage 3 during PE lessons, girls will be doing athletics and boys will be doing cricket. Over the next few weeks preparations will begin for Sports Day 2024. Please encourage your child to represent their form in a range of track and field events that will be on offer. Cameron Parker continues his work with Year 10 students: discussing aspirations, motivations and focusing them ahead of upcoming mock exams.
