

World Book Day was created to celebrate books and reading. In the UK, the focus is on encouraging children and young people to read for pleasure.


The aim is for children to be able to get together and share a love of reading.

On Friday, 7th February, our Year 11 students had the fantastic opportunity to watch a live performance of An Inspector Calls by J.B. Priestley, brought to life by the talented actors of Katch 22 Theatre Company. The performance took place in our brand-new school hall, providing the perfect setting for an immersive theatrical experience.

The production captivated the audience, with characters such as Eric and Mr. Birling portrayed in a compelling and believable way. Following the play, students engaged in a 20-minute Q&A session, where the actors praised them for their thoughtful and insightful questions. The cast commented on how engaged and inquisitive our students were, with one actor highlighting their enthusiasm and depth of understanding.

Many students took the opportunity to speak with the actors after the performance to express their enjoyment of the production. One actor even remarked on receiving a particularly firm handshake from a student—just one of many signs of appreciation for the performance. Students also shared that watching the play has boosted their confidence in revising for their English Literature exams. One student humorously remarked, "We hate Mr. Birling, but you play him well!"

The excitement and appreciation for the performance were evident through the smiles, applause, and enthusiastic feedback. It was a truly enriching experience that brought the text to life and deepened students' understanding of the play.

Attendance Matters at Jewellery Quarter Academy

At Jewellery Quarter Academy, attendance and punctuality are at the heart of academic success. We believe that attendance is everybody's responsibility. We remind all students and parents that the academy day starts promptly at 8:30 am, and arriving on time is crucial to ensure that students maximise their learning opportunities. Poor punctuality can have a significant impact on attendance and, ultimately, on students' progress.

We are delighted to report that **318 students** currently have an attendance record of **98% or higher**, with an impressive **287 students** maintaining **100% attendance** so far this term. Well done to all of you—this is a real achievement! Research strongly supports the link between attendance and academic success & outcomes.

To celebrate and encourage excellent attendance, we've introduced several exciting initiatives:

Introduction of a Breakfast Club: The Breakfast Club opens at **7:45 am**, allowing students to come into the academy, have breakfast, and participate in activities such as table tennis and football. There is also a dedicated revision space for GCSE students.

Attendance Cup: We are excited to announce that the **Attendance Cup** will be returning next half term! This friendly competition encourages students to maintain high attendance, with prizes awarded to the winning form groups.
