

OPPORTUNITY- Science

The Many Lives of PET #2

This term our year 10 students got to witness a performance put on by Stan's Cafe about the sustainability of plastic, in which the main characters were all... different objects made of plastic. The play was actually written in the past month, using feedback gathered from a focus group of JQA students, when Stan's Cafe and University of Birmingham visited the school earlier in the year to educate students on how plastic is made and the many different types of polymers we come across in our day to day life. With a mix of live action acting and puppetry, the play discussed many serious concepts, including environmentalism, greenwashing, and the moral responsibilities of businesses. We were thrilled that the performers at Stan's cafe were able to put on such an engaging and informative show for our year 10s.

Physics Olympiad

Some of our top physicists in year 9 had the opportunity to compete in the first ever CORE Physics Olympiad competition. The students competed in three different events, including designing their own wind turbine, building a paper tower capable of holding a tin of tomatoes, and designing their own Gravitrax course for a marble to run through. The students had to apply their knowledge of energy, forces and efficiency to be successful in each event. After the points were tallied, JQA were named joint champions, alongside Arena Academy. Our very own, Layson Bormanis, was named as one of the star pupils of the competition, as highlighted by judges from across all four CORE schools.







RESPECT- Every child needs a mentor

Every Child Needs a Mentor was founded by Author, TEDx Speaker, and two-time Mentor of the Year Winner Herman Stewart. He is the creator of ABM (Asset-Based Mentoring) and has over twenty years of mentoring experience supporting students, schools, and parents.

Herman Stewart came in to Jewellery Quarter Academy to deliver different assemblies that were catered for each year group. Students enjoyed the assembly and listened intently to what was being delivered.







RESPECT- National Careers Week

National Careers Week (NCW) usually takes place in the first week of March every year. This initiative aims to highlight the importance of effective careers guidance within the education sector across the UK, offering an array of free resources designed to enhance the career guidance process. NCW serves as a pivotal moment in the academic calendar, providing young individuals with the opportunity to explore, discover, and get excited about their future career paths.

The essence of NCW is to facilitate a concerted effort among schools, colleges, universities, and various educational institutions, enabling them to collectively focus on careers guidance. At Jewellery Quarter Academy, we invited a representative from Goldman Sachs to deliver assemblies across some of our year groups. He talked about all the different careers at Goldman Sachs and his own career path. The students really enjoyed the talk.







EXCELLENCE AT JQA-Attendance

Attendance Matters at Jewellery Quarter Academy

At Jewellery Quarter Academy, attendance and punctuality are at the heart of academic success. We believe that attendance is everybody's responsibility. We remind all students and parents that the academy day starts promptly at 8:30 am, and arriving on time is crucial to ensure that students maximise their learning opportunities. Poor punctuality can have a significant impact on attendance and, ultimately, on students' progress.

We can report that **110 students** currently have an attendance record of **98% or higher**, with **102 students** maintaining **100% attendance** so far this Spring term. Well done to all of you—this is a real achievement! Research strongly supports the link between attendance and academic success & outcomes.

To celebrate and encourage excellent attendance, we've introduced several exciting initiatives:

Introduction of a Breakfast Club: The Breakfast Club opens at **7:45 am**, allowing students to come into the academy, have breakfast, and participate in activities such as table tennis and football. There is also a dedicated revision space for GCSE students.

Attendance Cup: We are excited to announce that the **Attendance Cup** will be returning next half term! This friendly competition encourages students to maintain high attendance, with prizes awarded to the winning form groups.
